

Challenges - Joint Working

Pre Event

Data sharing to support those who are care experienced. Through the use of SDS Participation Portal we struggle to identify keyworkers as we don't access social work information.

Sharing data to support CEYP to achieve their full potenetial without having to repeat their story over and over- safety net to suppor thought ups and downs of their learning journey.

It can be hard to know what scaffolding is already in place for a family you are supporting - sometimes making duplication of work common and organisations for finding out about other service's involvement until later on in the support process.

Collaboration with some stakeholders

Restrictions from information being passed from schools to college when pupils leave school and move to further Education

lack of partnership working and opportunities to support young people due to pressures and lack of commitment from the top of the tree down.

To remove barriers to engagement and support for care experienced parents we do not record or share information to ensure parents feel comfortable to seek and engage in support (the only time we would record and report is if there was a serious welfare concern) however due to working differently to services within the system, it has prevented some services engaging with The Why Not Trust (The Village) and we have even had wellbeing funding from a local authority stopped and the reason given was because we would not use their system to record information about our care experienced parents due to our approach.
